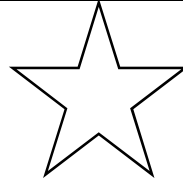

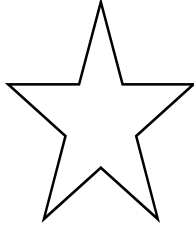

September is National Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

I thought it would be appropriate at this time to alert all the men in our Club that this is not just a woman's disease.

In mid August I noticed a small lump on my right nipple. Thinking it may have been caused by a bump while playing with the grand-children I let it go for a few weeks. The lump became larger and became quite tender when touched three weeks later. I called the doctor to have it checked out. Yes it is a little embarrassing being the only man called for his turn to have a mammogram at the Pavlic Center at Elm Brook Hospital. Oh well, embarrassing or not, I thought it was the proper thing to do. I had the mammogram on September 6th. After looking at the results the Radiologist decided I should also have an Ultra-Sound which he did immediately. His suggestion was to have a blood test which can now detect if there are traces of cancer in the body and could have the lump removed or wait six months and have it re-checked. On Sept. 7th I returned to the Vascular Surgeon and he decided not to remove the lump as long as there is not much pain because the mammogram and the ultra did not detect a cancer, however, I should come back in one year. Two different doctors, two different opinions, what's a guy suppose to do? I decided to play the wait and see game over the next couple of months. If it continues to grow then I will take the Radiologist advice since he sent me a letter on Sept. 11th requesting to see me in 6 months.
